TAKE TENN VIDEO DESCRIPTIONS

1. Improving Your Teaching – Dr. Charles Walker
A discussion of seven ways teachers can improve their teaching. Topics discussed include: being positive, varying teaching methods, being in control, making lectures exciting, being organized, using question and answer teaching, and teaching at the students' academic level. (55 min.)
2. Classroom Control and Discipline, Part I – Dr. Ardell Jacquot
A discussion about the difference between control and discipline and why both are essential to the teaching/learning process. Topics discussed include: reasons teachers lack control, purpose of control/discipline, results of poor control/discipline, and balancing discipline with love. (50 min.)
3. Classroom Control and Discipline, Part II – Dr. Ardell Jacquot
A discussion of proven practical ways to manage a classroom. Topics discussed include: suggestions for handling misbehavior that needs minor punishment, dealing with offenses that need more serious punishment, practical tips for maintaining control, and things teachers should never do. (55 min.)
4. Stop, Listen, Think – Teaching Thinking Skills – Dr. Beverly White
A discussion of the importance of teaching students to develop thinking skills. Topics discussed include: think as God thinks, ways to encourage thinking, teaching maturity not conformity, learning to ask questions, and applying knowledge to new situations. (50 min.)
5. Color Us Individuals – Mrs. Jackie Cline
A discussion of characteristics within an elementary classroom. Topics discussed include: the seven individual sets of characteristics common to elementary students, how to identify these characteristics in each student, and ways to help students with their social, spiritual, and academic deficiencies. (50 min.)
6. Teaching Listening Skills – Mrs. Helen Boen
An examination of the causes of weak auditory processing and listening skills with practical suggestions for improving these skills. Includes sample material for exercises in building listening skills, along with such tips as how to get students to visualize and how to turn reading comprehension into listening comprehension. (54 min.)
7. Legal Responsibilities and Liabilities of Teachers and Administrators – Mr. Glenn Stophel
A description of the obligations of educators to students in regard to supervision, proper instruction, and maintenance of equipment. Discusses defenses, degrees of negligence, elements of damages and how they relate to Christian school educators. Rulings in actual court cases provide helpful illustrations. (55 min.)
8. Christian Philosophy of Education, Part I – Dr. Wayne Haston
An examination of education through the philosophical world view teachings endorsed by humanism and Biblical Christianity. Discussion includes how humanists and Christians view the school as it relates to the teacher, objectives, curriculum, methodology, evaluation, and discipline. The question: How Christian is your "Christian school"? will be easily answered after viewing this video. (50 min.)
9. Christian Philosophy of Education, Part II – Dr. Wayne Haston
An explanation of the process of Biblical integration and why it should occur naturally and spontaneously in the classroom. Included is an overview of a typical Christian school curriculum and the seven common clusters of academic subjects. The use of graphics and diagrams illustrate the Biblical integration process. (50 min.)
10. The Parent-Teacher Conference – Dr. Charles Walker
A discussion of the three parts to a successful conference: preparing for the conference, rules governing the conference, and the "dos" and "don'ts" of the conference. Emphasis is placed upon how to establish open and effective communication between the teacher and the parents. (52 min.)
